Bryan Dooley: Public Death Chewday's, London 24 September - 5 November 2016 Excerpt from Public Death

Public Death is the theatrical result of several years' research by Bryan Dooley into dormant patents, currently owned by Google, designed to move data farms out to sea – to take intellectual property, give it physical presence in the form of cold storage, and set it adrift in international waters. Dooley's installation plays on themes of circulation, cultural signification, technological progress, and inevitable disaster. The show is accompanied by a fictional text, excerpted below, which takes the form of a captain's ship log.
